Method


Preheat the oven to 180 degrees. Lightly grease a cooking tray or line with baking paper, so that the cookies don't stick.

In a large bowl, mix carrots, apple, oil and molasses together.

Fold in salt, oats and flour until well mixed. Spread dough in one big piece on the cookie sheet. Score dough with a knife to make it easier to break apart after baking (or use cookie cutters to make shapes!). Cook until just brown on top (approximately 20 minutes). Let cool, break apart and serve!
